Crooked Creek Lake 2015 Family Campground Rules

In addition to United State Army Corps of Engineers Rules and Regulations (36 Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter III, Part 327) the following rules apply to the Crooked Creek Lake Family Campground.

1. **Campsites are on a first come-first serve basis.** The campground opens at 9 a.m., **May 15** and close at 3 p.m. on Labor Day, **Sept. 7**. The fee is \$15.00 per night. To be considered properly registered, a camper completes the registration envelope with name, address, vehicle information, phone number, pays the proper fee, displays the permit stub on their post and occupies the site. Persons who possess a Federal Golden Age, Golden Access Card (disabled), America the Beautiful Senior or Access (disabled) are entitled to a 50 percent reduction in fees (no Federal Discount Cards are issued from Crooked Creek Lake). The PA Access Card is not applicable. Only people 18-years old or older may register for a site. Checkout time is 4 p.m. on the last day marked on the permit.
2. For families up to eight people and living in the same residence, one camping shelter plus an additional small two- or three-person tent is permitted. Families over eight people or individuals from another residence must rent a separate site. An Organized Group Campground can be reserved by non-profit, chartered, structured groups having an organizational chart, or a group with an organizational affiliation. These include groups such as Boy/Girl Scout Troops, Youth Groups, Hiking Clubs, Church Groups, Social Service Organizations, etc. Groups with none of the above are to use the Family Campground. Organized Groups wishing to stay in the Family Campground require prior approval from Park Management.
3. Because of space limitations, safety and protection of the campsites from overuse, campers are limited to their primary sleeping shelter, and either two vehicles or a vehicle and boat trailer combination. Extra parking is available outside the campground gate. Contact a Park Ranger if you have questions.
4. **Campsite #15 is reserved for disabled individuals** requiring electric for medical support. Examples include recharging wheelchair batteries, sleep apnea machines, oxygen devices, refrigeration of medicines, etc. No extension cords may be run from this site to other sites.
5. Where a campsite is equipped with a gravel spur, all wheeled camping units/vehicles must be parked on the gravel spur. Visitors can park excess vehicle(s) in the overflow parking lot located outside the Family Campground.
6. **Possession or use of alcoholic beverages, fireworks and firearms is prohibited at all times.**
7. **Consideration of others.** Campers must be set up by 10 p.m. Registered campers are responsible for the conduct of their guests. Guests are to leave the campground by the **10 p.m. to 8 a.m. Quiet Hour** --The use of generators during this period is not permitted. At all times, pets must be restrained on a maximum 6-foot leash, an owner must always be present, and barking dogs can not be tolerated any time of day.
8. Parents must supervise their children on playground equipment which is available from 8 a.m. until sunset. Bicycle riding is not permitted before sunrise or after dark. Bicycle operators must follow all helmet laws and guidelines. **Children under 12 are required to wear a helmet at all times.**
9. Swimming is at your own risk and only permitted at Tunnelville Beach. Registered campers are entitled to use the Beach without paying the User Fee. Passes are issued by patrolling Rangers.
10. Please place all garbage in the dumpsters provided.

11. In addition to possibly being issued a citation, camping permits may be revoked at any time for violations of park rules and regulation. Credit vouchers for unused portion of permit will not be given if this occurs. **Refunds are not available.**
