LOCKWOOD NEW PITTSBURGH DISTRICT OPERATIONS DIVISION CHIEF

Pittsburgh – Richard C. Lockwood was named the new chief of Operations and Readiness Division of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Pittsburgh District effective Jan. 26. He comes to Pittsburgh from the Corps' Philadelphia District where he served as the chief of Physical Support Branch and then as assistant chief of Operations Division.

Since an early age Lockwood's life has revolved around water. "I first went to sea at the age of eight," he stated. "I have served as unlicensed seaman, licensed deck and engineering officer, port engineer, operations manager, design engineer, construction manager, project manager, program manager, strategic planner and supervisor/manager of various organizations."

Lockwood isn't a stranger to Pittsburgh District. When he worked for the Marine Design Center in Philadelphia, he was the project manager for the Pittsburgh District's MV *Raymond C. Peck*, a Corps towboat. His principle involvement with water resources has been with deep sea and inland river vessels, dredging, marine construction, transportation infrastructure and watershed planning.

Lockwood graduated from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy with a bachelor's degree. He received his master's degree from Drexel University in civil engineering.
