

**PROJECT FACT SHEET
CONSTRUCTION GENERAL**

PROJECT NAME AND STATE: Nanty Glo Environmental Restoration, PA

LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The abandoned Webster Coal Mine is located in Nanty Glo, Cambria County, Pennsylvania. Water from the mine is discharged into Pergrin Run. The mine water will be treated by constructing a passive treatment system on a 19-acre property between Pergrin Run and South Branch Blacklick Creek. A Successive Alkalinity Producing System consisting of dual vertical flow ponds and a wetland is being constructed to remove acid mine drainage pollutants to promote restoration of the aquatic ecosystem of an estimated 6.2 stream miles of the Lower South Branch Blacklick Creek.

Total Federal Cost:	\$3,169,706
Total Non-Federal Cost:	\$1,056,569

NON-FEDERAL SPONSOR: Cambria County Conservation and Recreation Authority (CCCRA)

CURRENT STATUS: Project construction contract awarded September 6, 2002. Above cost includes only the construction phase of the project. Currently the project is experiencing unforeseen differing site conditions which have increased costs. Therefore the Total Project Cost has increased. Completion of construction is anticipated in September 2004.

AUTHORIZATION: Section 331, Water Resources Development Act of 1992 (Public Law 102-580).
