

**PROJECT FACT SHEET
CONSTRUCTION GENERAL**

PROJECT NAME AND STATE: Section 206, Continuing Authorities Program (CAP) - Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration Projects

LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: This program services the portions of five states that fall within the boundaries of the Pittsburgh District. This program involves the study, design and construction of aquatic system restoration and protection projects that improve the quality of the environment, are in the public interest and are cost effective.

TOTAL PROJECT COST: Varies by Project
Total Federal Cost: \$5,000,000 Maximum per Project
Total Non-Federal Cost: 35% of Total Project Cost

NON-FEDERAL SPONSOR: This program requires a non-federal sponsor to cost share at a rate of 35% of total project cost. The first \$10,000 is 100% federal.

CURRENT STATUS: There are currently nine active projects in various stages of planning, design and construction. However, as of March 04, the funds for Sec 206 projects have been cut. There are no answers yet as to how the entire Sec 206 Program will fare in the future.

AUTHORIZATION: Section 206, Water Resources Development Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-303), as amended.
